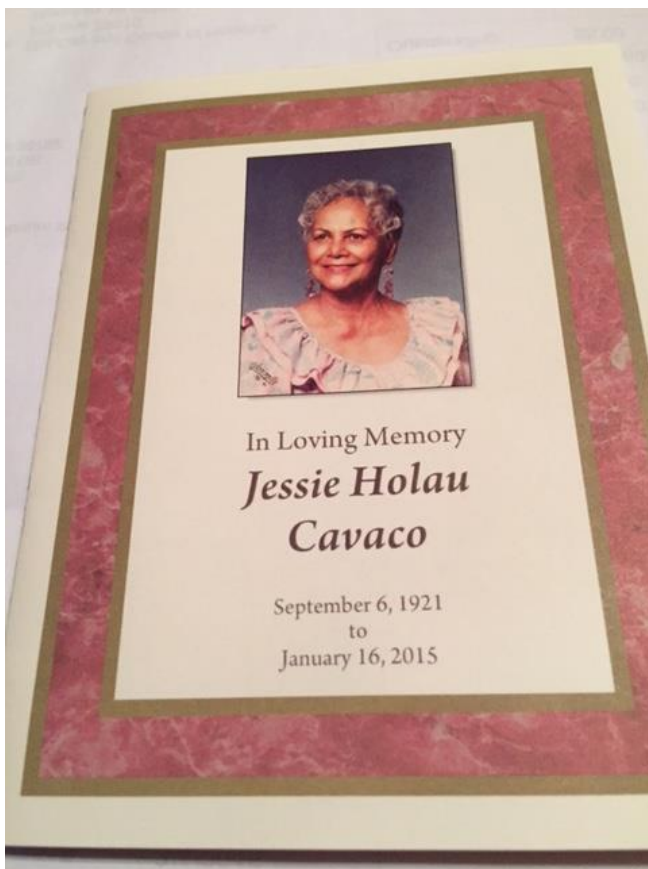

THE MEMBER SELECTED MUST BE A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE CLUB AND A MEMBER FOR AT LEAST FIVE YEARS BEFORE BEING SELECTED. A MEMBER CAN ONLY WIN THIS AWARD ONCE. AFTER BEING SELECTED AS THE OUTSTANDING MEMBER OF THE YEAR THEY ARE EXPECTED TO BE OUTSTANDING FOREVER MORE. THE RECIPIENT CHOSEN THIS YEAR IS A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING AND HAS PAID THEIR DUES.
